

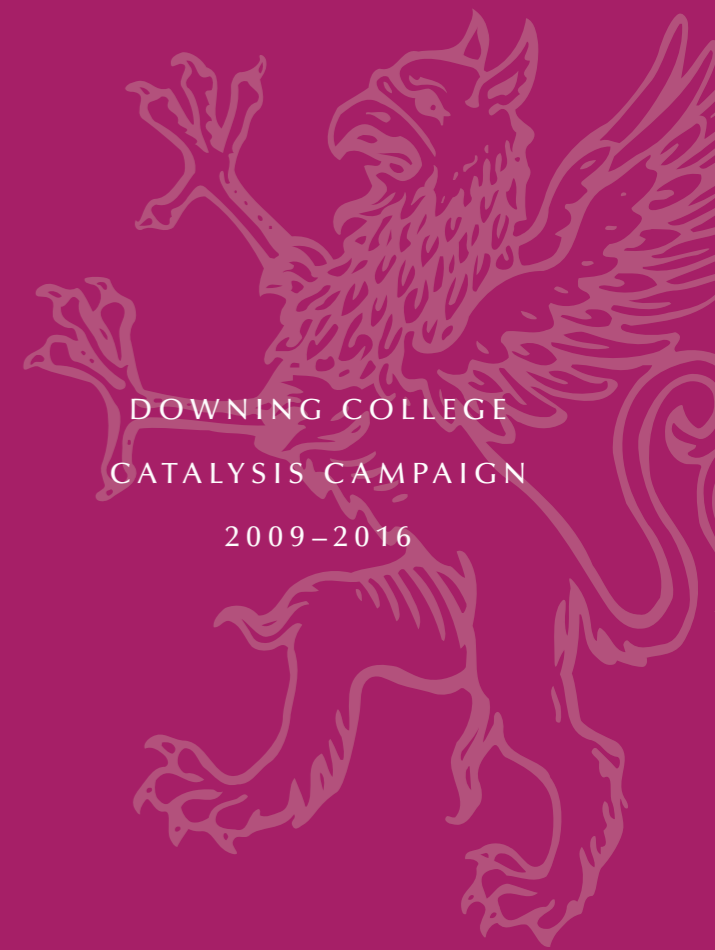

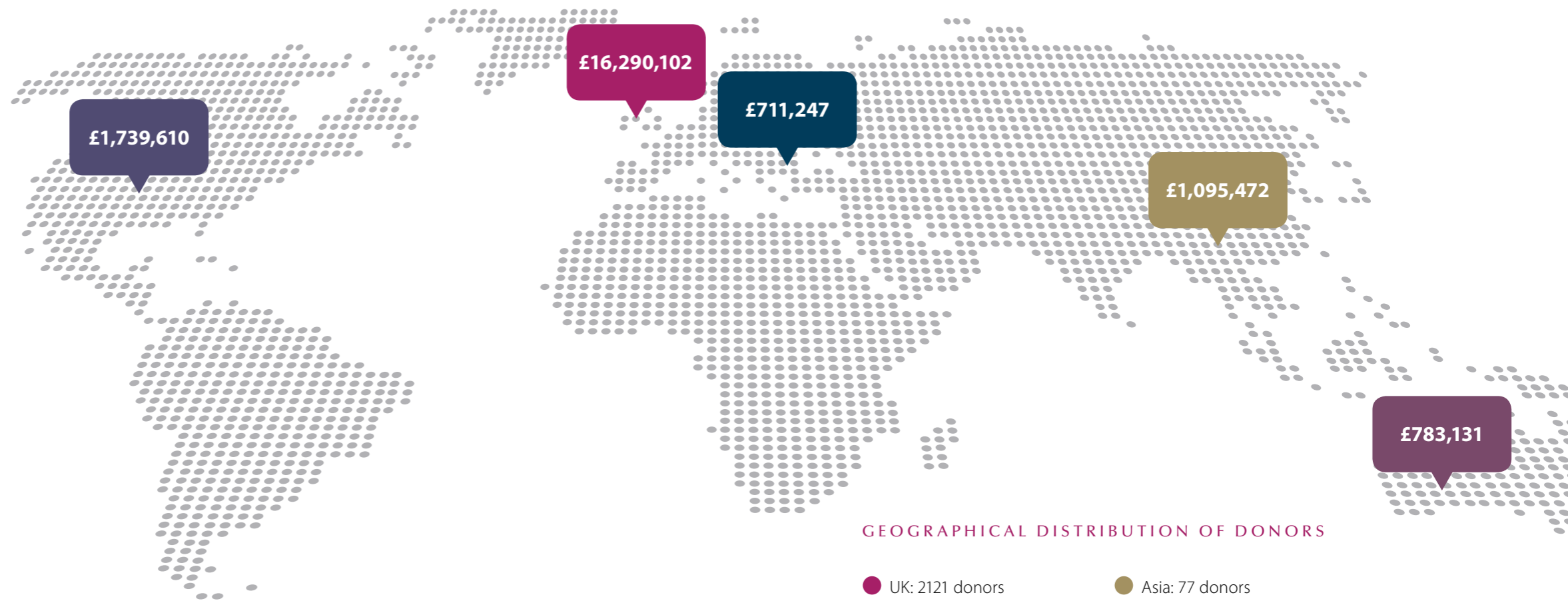

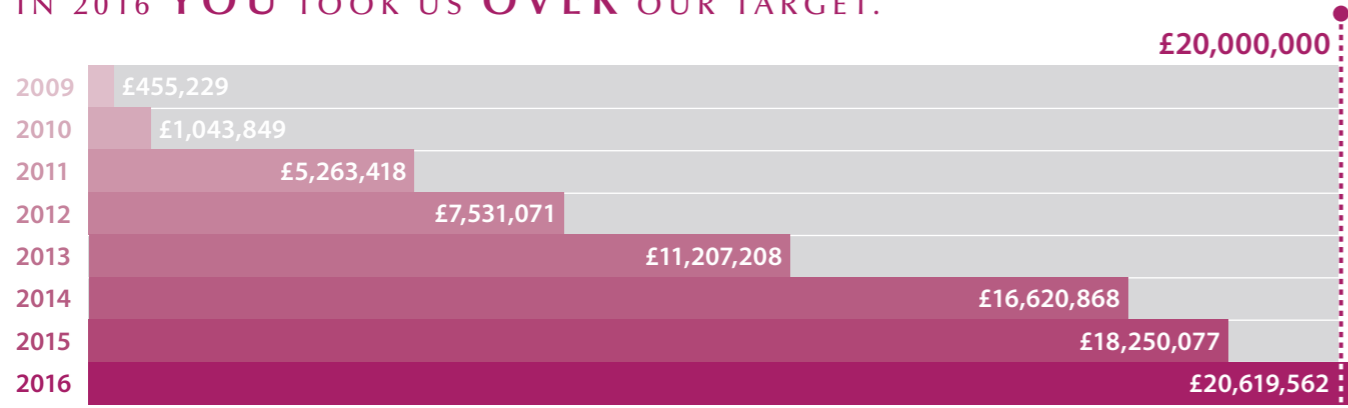


GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF DONORS

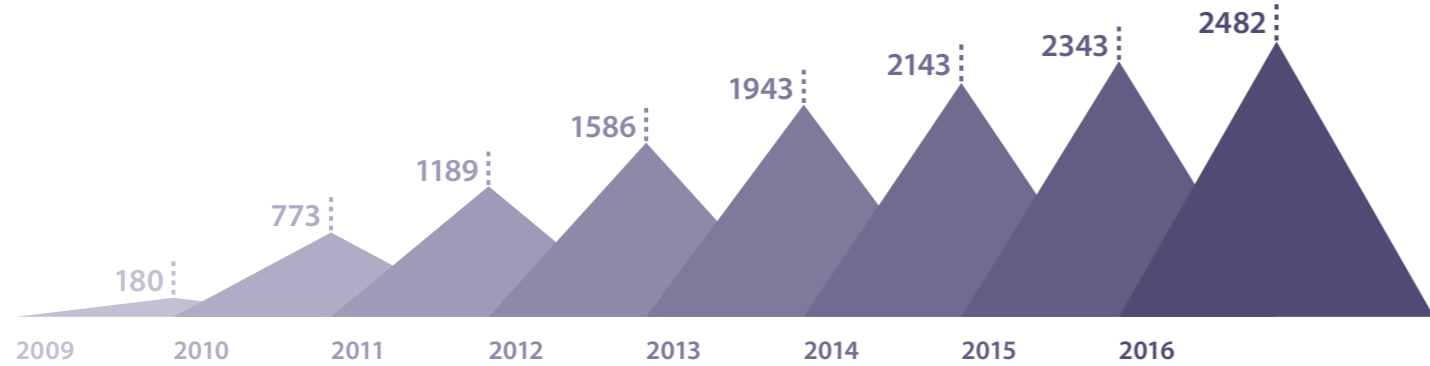
- UK: 2121 donors

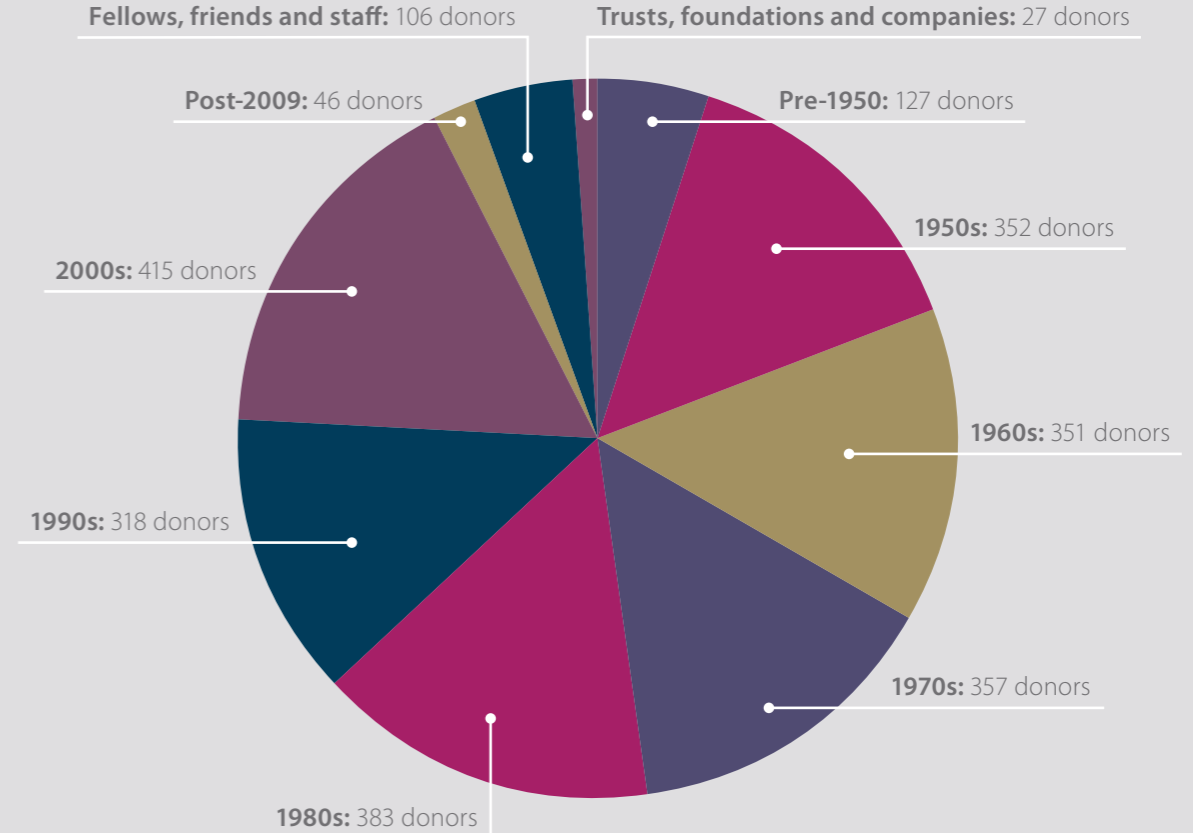

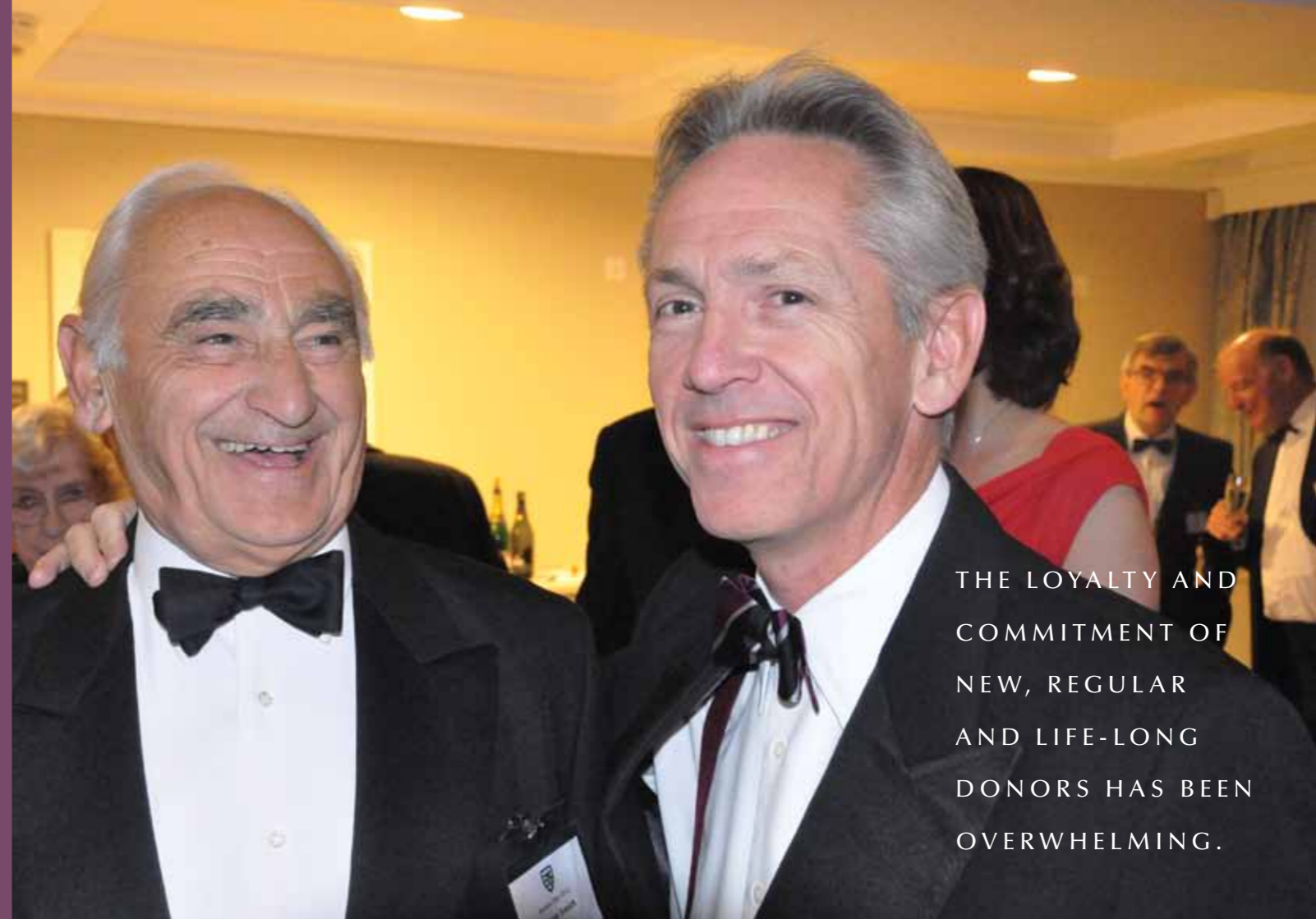


AGE DISTRIBUTION (BY MATRICULATION YEARS)

THE IMPACT OF OUR MEMBERS AND FRIENDS ON THE COLLEGE

We asked for support to bring our students within the Domus: we were able, thanks to gifts of £7.3 million, to convert Griphon House and create First Court with Battcock Lodge. With £5.3 million raised for teaching and research, we can now support two fellows in neuroscience, a fellow in laser manufacturing, and a research fellow in biomedical sciences. The need for hardship grants in a world of high tuition fees and inadequate student loans was well understood by our members, many of whom benefitted from free tuition and generous grants. The income from an additional £6.7 million will support students in need and enable

our graduates to take their studies further through studentships. Our buildings – even our car park – have been restored because members are generous.

But the goal is more than simply preserving our heritage: we aim to respond to and foster the interests of our community, for which we received £1.3 million. Alumni loyally support our Boat Club, sponsoring professional coaching. And, unusually for a Cambridge college, we have a state-of-the-art theatre, a perfect organ and Britain's newest art gallery. These gifts bear witness to the impact of our members and friends on the College that they help to create.

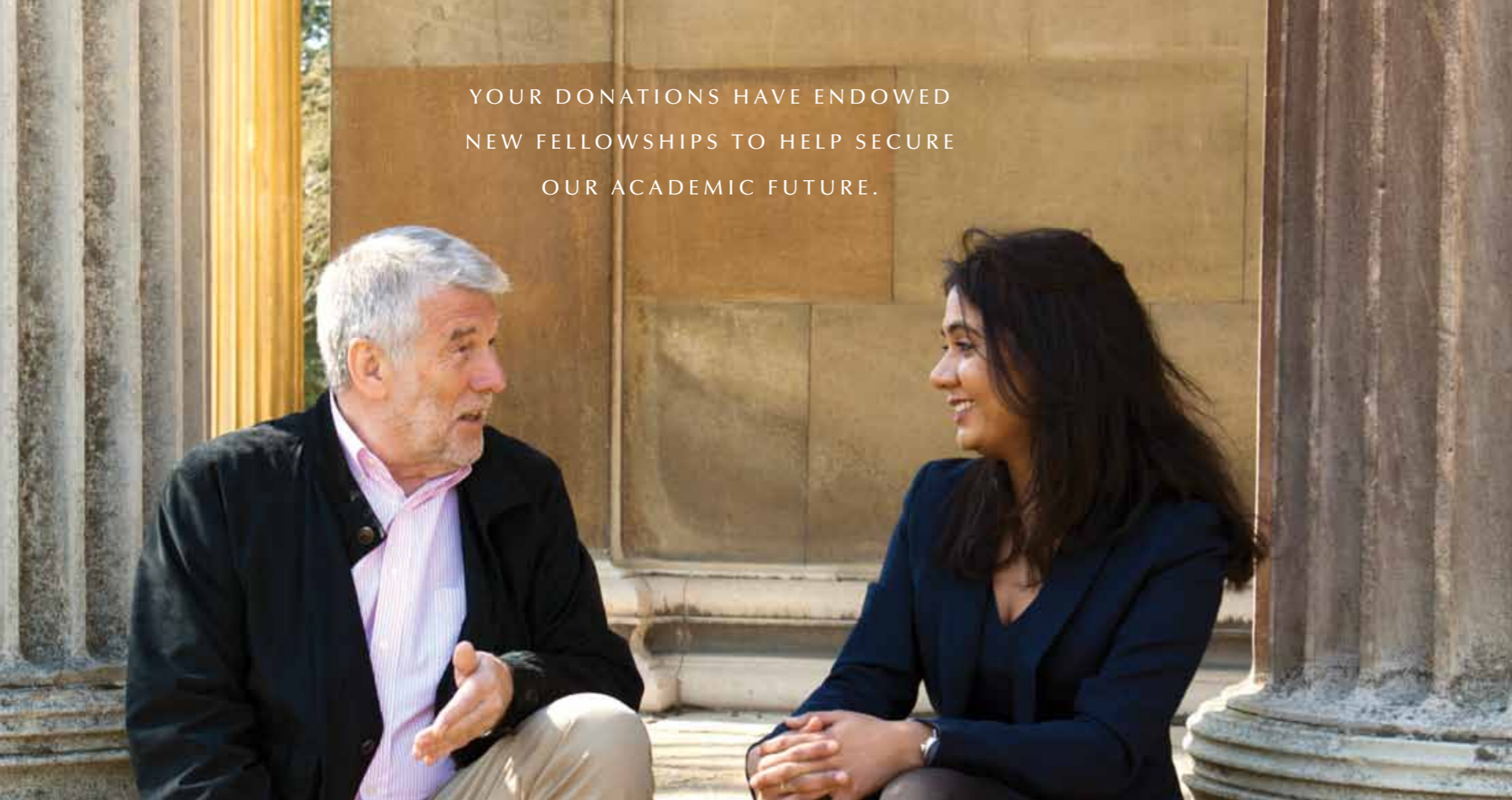
